

About Us

he Sisters of Holy Cross founded Holy Cross Kindergarten in 1959 to serve the children and families of greater Manchester. The goals of the program were to foster the children's physical growth, their religious and emotional development, their intellectual curiosity, healthy interpersonal relationships, and social etiquette. The original group consisted of eight children who were five-years-old, and the mission was to provide an outstanding education to prepare them for Grade 1.

As the needs of the community changed, the kindergarten became **Holy Cross Early Childhood Center (HCECC).** What was once an academic program only for kindergarteners is now a developmentally appropriate program for ages 3-7 years old focusing on the uniqueness of each child in his/her social, emotional, physical, and cognitive growth. Today, it is open 50 weeks per year, from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. HCECC is a NH Licensed Program, by the NH Child Care Licensing Unit, a Licensed Plus Program by the NH Child Development Bureau, and recently received certification as a **Nature Explore Classroom.** Our Program is an ongoing evolution as we continue to create a natural outdoor learning experience that is as important as our indoor classrooms.

In Loving Memory

Sr. Lucille Blais (Gerard, Martyr) April 2, 1928 - September 6, 2021



Born in Springfield MA, Sister Lucille entered the Sisters of Holy Cross in 1947 and pronounced her final vows in 1954. Sister received her Bachelor of Arts degree from Notre Dame College and earned more credits from several other college institutions.

Sister taught in St. Albans, Vermont, Montreal, PQ, Adams and Springfield Massachusetts, Manchester, Nashua, Rollinsford and Franklin, New Hampshire. After leaving fulltime teaching, Sr. Lucille served as a tutor and a teacher's aide in several schools. She also worked as a receptionist at Blessed Sacrament Parish, Manchester, NH and also visited the homebound.

Sister is survived by many cherished nieces and nephews. She was predeceased by her parents, her brother, Harvey and her sister Rita.

Sr. Louise Tarpey (Sr. Louise-de-Marillac) March 15, 1928 - October 9, 2021



Born in New Bedford, MA, Sister entered the Congregation in 1946 and pronounced her final vows in 1953.

Sr. Louise was an elementary school teacher in New Hampshire and Massachusetts from 1948 to 1950. Along with teaching Kindergarten at St. Leo's in Gonic NH. She also was

the church organist and music teacher.

The community recognizing Sr. Louise's Gift of Leadership named her in charge of different houses from 1974 to 1993 where her kindness and gentleness were experienced by many. After her retirement in 1994, she volunteered at the Elliot Hospital knitting hats for new-born and premature babies, she also volunteered for the community.

She was predeceased by her parents and her brother, Charles. She is survived by her sister-in-law, Judy and nephews, grandnephews and grandniece.

Sr. Louise will be long remembered for her quiet presence and her contagious smile.

Sr. Georgette Caron (Sr. Georgette of Auvergne) April 12, 1925 - November 21, 2021



Born in Nashua, NH sister entered the Congregation in 1942 and pronounced her final vows in 1949. She served the Congregation for 79 years.

Sister Georgette obtained a BA degree from Notre Dame College and an MS degree in Biology from Notre Dame University in Indiana. She tauqht in

Elementary and High School before going on to teach biology at Notre Dame College. She was Chairperson of the Biology Department and the Lab Coordinator. One of her great accomplishments was that of establishing a Holy Cross Scholarship Fund.

After leaving the College, she was Director of Transportation at St. George Manor. In 2008 she retired and in 2016 moved to Holy Cross Health Center.

She was predeceased by her parents six brothers, and her sister Jeannette Caron, CSC. She is survived by two sisters Fernande Lavoie and Lucienne Vaillancourt.

Sr. Jacqueline Kirouac (Sr. Paul-Henry) March 14, 1939 – June 8, 2022



Born in Manchester, she was the only daughter of the Kirouac's six children. Sister entered the Congregation in 1957 and pronounced her final vows in 1964.

Sr. Jackie earned a BA degree at Notre Dame College in Manchester. She taught for many years in Massachusetts and new Hampshire. She was also a teacher, coach and administrative assis-

tant at Trinity High School in Manchester, then worked in the Catholic School Department for the Diocese of Manchester, NH.

In her later years, she served the community in Manchester at St. George Manor and Holy Cross Health Center.

Sr. Jackie was predeceased by her parents and four of her brothers.

She is survived by her brother Louis Kirouac and his wife, Doris, of Atlanta, GA; a sister-in-law, Jeanne, of Naples FL; many nieces and nephews. Two God sons, Paul Kirouac and Joseph Lebel; many friends and treasured community members, especially Sr. Pauline Lebel and Sr. Jacqueline Brodeur.
